



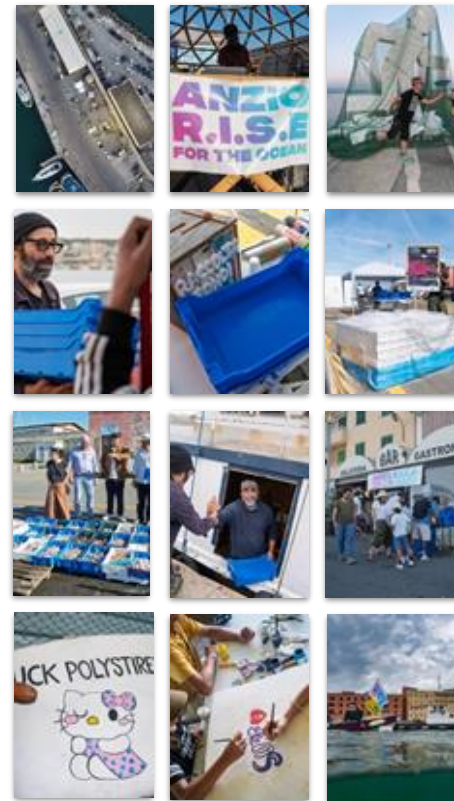

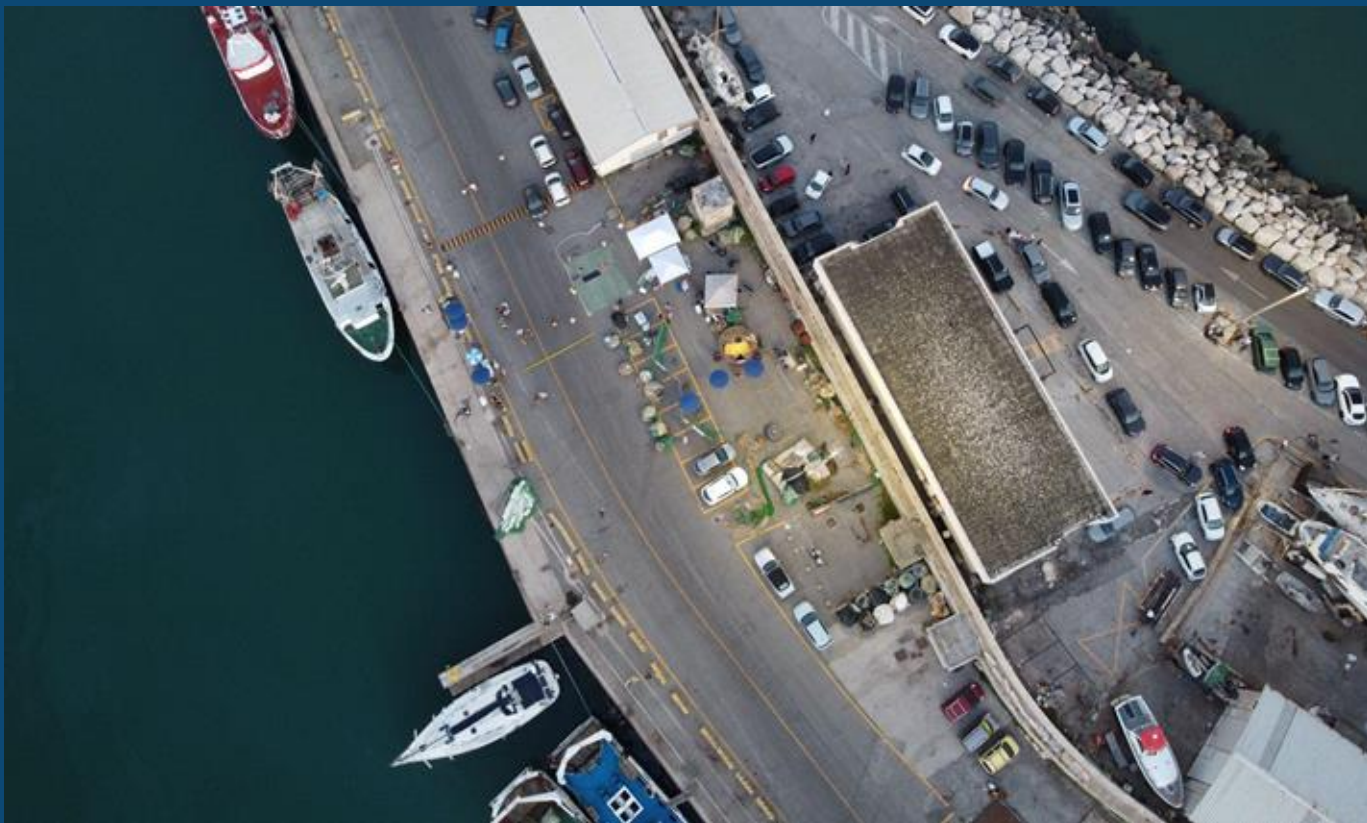

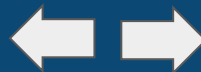
Anzio R.I.S.E. for the OCEAN is a participatory art and science project that engages fisherfolk, migrant workers, and local residents to tackle marine pollution caused by single-use expanded polystyrene (EPS) fish crates. The initiative promotes the adoption of 3,000 reusable eco-crates, combining citizen science, artistic co-creation, and supply-chain innovation to reduce waste at its source. Participants monitor the crates' journey, collect environmental and social data, take part in clean-ups and art workshops, and create a public harbour installation from discarded EPS. The project concludes with a community festival and a digital toolkit to support replicable, community-led coastal resilience.

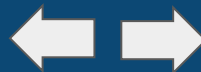


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Anzio Rise for the Ocean is a Participatory Art Initiative (PAI) supported by PartArt4OW that combines science, art, and citizen participation to address the critical issue of styrofoam pollution in Porto d'Anzio.

Marcello Dato explains how a five-month accelerator program led to the discovery that styrofoam is an outdated logistics system that poses a severe risk to the marine environment, fragmenting into micro-plastics and affecting flora and fauna.

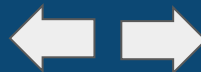
By "weaving within the fabric" of the local community, the project engaged fishers, restaurants, and families through cultural labs and the "Adopt a Fish Crate" campaign during the traditional "Mazzama fish market". The initiative culminated in a collaborative artwork with world-renowned artist Dadara, using 200 discarded fish crates to shake minds and communicate on a "natural ground" where everyone can meet at the same eyesight.

This mission reflects the Sailing Lab's broader goal of documenting coastal communities' emotional attachment to the sea and fostering collective action against the "wicked problems" facing our oceans today



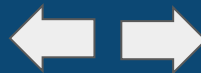


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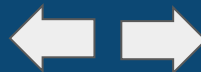


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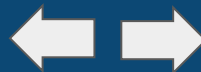


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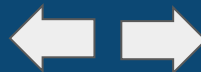
