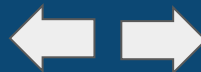


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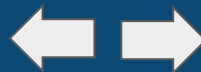


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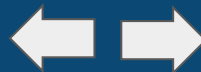


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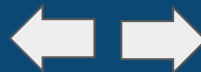


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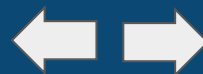


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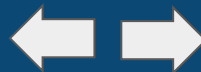


The wall combines art with utility, preventing waste from blowing away in the wind



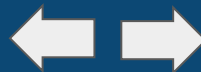


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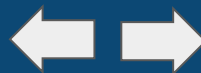
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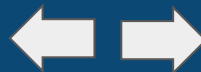
